When Edith Walsh attended Titchfield High School, one of her former teacher remarked that she was a pleasure to teach. ## Commentary: Education and Sports\*

In a three part expose on *Education and Sports* that appeared in the *Jamaica Observer* on October 4-6, 2010, Dr. Lascelve (Muggy) Graham, the former St. George's College Manning Cup, All Schools, and All Manning Cup football captain, took a long hard critical look at the relationship between Education and Sports in Jamaican High Schools. Although he supports a strong link between education and sports, he bemoaned the overriding focus on winning that has caused sports' role in education, and sports' role as a developmental tool in high school to be diminished, subverted, undermined and corrupted. This he noted is evidenced by the alarming importation of highly talented players/athletes into the high schools with the primary objective of winning. He cautioned that we should not allow winning to trump everything else and to skew or corrupt the purpose of sports in high school. Furthermore, he suggested that the standards in schools not be lowered to facilitate talented sports students.

From time immemorial, national leaders and public administrators have stressed the importance of education to economic development and Dr. Graham's commentary attested to this. The overriding goal of education is to build a critical mass of highly trained individuals. This will go a far way in helping Jamaica compete more effectively in industry and trade on the world stage. As Dr. Graham puts it, education makes people more creative, more adaptive and more proactive. We add to Dr. Graham's list of benefits, education's influence on other important areas such as health. The greater the level of education, the greater the returns on investment in health, as individuals are better able to read and understand medical directions. We also find that the greater the level of education and the greater the level of productivity, the greater the ability to save and invest in health, thereby further impacting positively labor's productivity. Education provides positive externalities, or spillover benefits, as trained individuals tend to have a positive influence on those around them including an improvement in the level of reasoning and thinking.

What should be the role of sports in our schools? Dr. Graham suggested the following:

- a. Sports should help to fortify character and develop proper attitudes. Sports should seek to make students better persons.
- b. Sports should help students who have satisfied the admission requirements without concessions, to make right decisions and to have the strength of character, the mental toughness to carry them out.
- c. Sports' focus must be developmental; it must be a tool that can be used to help inculcate life skills that will prove beneficial to the student's success.
- d. Sports should help prepare youngsters for life and to acquire/strengthen life skills that can facilitate academic, as well as other areas of success.
- e. Sports should help to prepare students behaviorally, emotionally, socially as well as technically. It should be a way to help students develop coping skills, self-belief, resilience, and relationship skills.

For most of us, there is no greater love than that which we have for the high school we attended. We have attended many alumni events and have witnessed first-hand efforts to raise funds year after year. Students that are presently attending high schools in Jamaica depend on contributions from alumni associations in South Florida, and we owe it to them to ensure that they develop first as students with a solid education. For those who excel at extracurricular activities, we do hope that these activities will complement their academics.

Winning CHAMPS after many decades is certainly a feat that calls for jubilation. However, we should be equally overjoyed or even more overjoyed when students from our alma mater gain acceptance to tertiary institutions to build on their high school educational foundation; we should celebrate when Rhodes Scholars are selected; and we should encourage our school boards and principals to strive first for academic excellence.

## **Glenmuir Student Named Most Outstanding Researcher**

**KINGSTON (JIS); Monday, October 25, 2010**

Glenmuir High School Student, Renee Osbourne has been named Most Outstanding Child Researcher by organisers of a two-day Caribbean Child Research Conference, held at the Jamaica Conference Centre in Kingston, from October 20-21. This year's conference was held under the theme: 'Five Years before 2015: The Millennium Development Goals and Child Rights in the Caribbean', and featured researchers presenting their findings on various issues affecting children as well as children presenting their own research.

Renee was one of 10 high school students who were chosen to present their research at the conference. In addition to winning the overall prize, her research titled: 'The key to the Future development of Jamaica Resides in protecting our Children from Violence and abuse in the Home', was also singled out as the Best Written Paper.

Second place went to Sashene Brown of Fern Court High, whose research looked at: 'Abortion among Teenagers: What are the Causes and Consequences of Teenage Girls Having an Abortion in my Community?' Dunoon Park Technical High School student, Rushane Finch placed third for his research titled: 'An Examination of Reasons Why There are So Many Children Living on the Streets of Kingston and St. Andrew'. Rushane also received the prize for Best Overall Presentation (male) and Best Methodology. Nicole Wallace of Glenmuir High received the prize for Best Overall Presentation (female) for her research: 'Sixth Form Education Should Be a Right, Not a Privilege for Young Jamaicans between the Ages of 15 and 18 years'.

This year the Conference also added an essay competition to involve primary school students. They were asked to write on the topic: 'What does child rights mean to me?' First place went to Tavoy Barrett of Port Morant Primary and Junior High School; second was Christopher Stewart of Clonmel Primary and Junior High School; and third place went to Jody-Kay Bent of Breadnut Hill Primary School. Kalia Edwards of Content Gap Primary School received special commendation for her essay.

During yesterday's (October 21) awards ceremony, the Conference also honoured Children's Advocate, Mary Clarke, for her contribution to the promotion of child rights in Jamaica. "I am grateful and humbled by your kind words of recognition of my efforts as Children's Advocate to promote and protect the rights of children. I can hardly believe it's been five years," she said. She also praised the organisers of the conference for giving children a platform on which to speak. Mrs. Clarke said it was clear that Jamaica's future is in good hands, but cautioned that "they (the children) will succeed as much as we as adults help them to succeed."

The conference also saw the launch of the book, 'Promoting Child Rights through Research, Volume Two'. The book contains 10 papers selected from those presented at the 2007 and 2008 conference. It reflects the commitment of conference organisers to promote child rights through research and fulfills one of the main objectives of the conference - to strengthen the link between evidence-based research and policy formulation and implementation.

The conference was spearheaded by the Sir Arthur Lewis Institute of Social and Economic Studies at the University of the West Indies, in collaboration with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF), the Environmental Foundation of Jamaica (EFJ) and other partners.
