## Jamaica National Helping to Improve Education through the Centers of Excellence Program

Jarrett was guest speaker at the Mile Gully High School 2010 graduation ceremony, held at the school in Manchester last Wednesday.*

Speaking at the 2010 graduation ceremony at Mile Gully High School in Manchester last Wednesday, Earl Jarrett, chairman of the Mutual Building Societies Foundation (MBSF), opined that although the country continues to grapple with various economic and social issues, development of the educational process needs to be prioritized. He also noted that the transformation of the country's educational system needs urgent attention. Speaking to the 108 graduates, teachers and parents, Mr. Jarrett said that there are times when, given the many concerns about growing our country's economy, balancing the budget, eliminating crime and gangs, and facing the realities of building a just society, that we neglect one of our most urgent priorities, which is to make centers of excellence a priority for all Jamaican schools.

Making reference to the progress and changes at Mile Gully High since it came under the Centers of Excellence program in 2008, Jarrett emphasized that all upgraded high schools can succeed if they are assisted to acquire the resources they need. He then urged Jamaicans not to sideline upgraded high schools because of the negative perceptions about these institutions. Using the concept purported by Nigerian author **Chimamanda Adiche** - *The Danger of Single Story* – Mr. Jarrett made the point that schools are as good as they are perceived by the community.

"Single stories create stereotypes," he said. "Therefore, to some people in Manchester, Mile Gully is not such a good school. But, the problem with stereotypes is that they are limited in their scope and do not give you the total picture, and so many people do not bother to look beyond the school gate," he remarked, noting that many upgraded schools were in fact doing better than perceived, and could do as well as traditional high schools if they were assisted with building capacity.

Mile Gully High was placed among the top five non- traditional high schools in information technology in the 2009 Caribbean Secondary Examination Certificate examinations, with a pass rate of 98 per cent, Jarrett noted, pointing to one of the successes of the school.



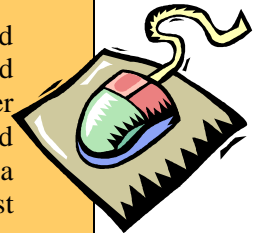

## ALL HIGH SCHOOLS EQUIPPED WITH COMPUTERS WITH INTERNET ACCESS

The country's 162 high schools have all been equipped with computers and local area network (LAN) facility for Internet access, under the national e-learning project, Minister with responsibility for Information, Telecommunications and Special Projects, Hon. Daryl Vaz, has disclosed. The project, which falls under the Office of the Prime Minister (OPM), is aimed at enhancing the learning environment in the classroom through the incorporation of information and communication technologies (ICT). The project is executed by the e-Learning Jamaica Company Limited (e-LJam), with funding provided by Universal Access Fund Limited (UAF), from levies on international calls to Jamaica.



Speaking in the 2010/11 Sectoral Debate in the House, today (July 27), Mr. Vaz informed that, in addition to the 162 schools, six special schools with students with learning and physical challenges, have also been outfitted with equipment and service, among other provisions. The Minister pointed out that over 40 video lectures were produced last year and delivered to schools, and broadcast on the Public Broadcasting Corporation of Jamaica (PBCJ). Additionally, he said teachers also benefitted, having been "exposed to the best instructional material and training resources."



"During the last (2009/10) fiscal year, over 10,000 of the targeted 11,000 teachers and lecturers were trained by HEART Trust/NTA, of which over 6,000 persons were certified to NCTVET levels. Additionally, 400 systems administrators were trained in network management as well as approximately 200 teachers received on-line training in ICT skills. Approximately 2,000 teachers were trained through the Mico University College, in the integration of technology in instructional delivery," the Minister informed.

Mr. Vaz said the project, which has been financed at a cost of over \$2 billion since November 2005, has been enhanced with the establishment of e-learning implementation committees in all schools and tertiary institutions where it is undertaken. "During this fiscal year, the e-Learning Company will develop and implement a focused intervention for 20 low-performing schools, using integrated learning software to assist in English, Mathematics and integrated science learning," Mr. Vaz further advised.

# *Jamaican Students "Shine" at Fisk University*

On Monday, May 3, 2010, I attended my third successive graduation ceremony at Fisk University, Nashville, Tennessee. In 2008 and 2009 it was to support family members, this time around it was to support a group of Jamaican students that I have grown close to overtime.

I was only spared being directly impacted by the flooding that occurred because an insistent cop denied me access to my hotel having driven up to a block away. I subsequently learned that all the occupants had to be evacuated just before the area was flooded by water from a river nearby that overflowed its banks, whew!!!!!!!!!! Talk about luck!

After driving all night Saturday and arriving in the rain Sunday morning, I was told it had been raining non-stop from Friday. This went on until late Sunday afternoon forcing a hasty change of venue for the graduation. Very interestingly, come Monday morning you had to break-out the sunglasses and shed your coat because of the sweltering heat.....and then some question the power of the "great man."

The 136<sup>th</sup> graduation exercise started at approximately 1.00 PM. The group consisted of 34 Jamaicans students from 18 different high schools namely: *KC (1), DeCarteret College (1), Convent of Mercy Academy (2), St. Mary High (1), Morant Bay High (2), Glenmuir High (1), Camperdown (4), Montego Bay High for Girls (5), Munro (2), Cornwall College (3), Clarendon College (1), St. George's (1), Mount Alvernia (1), Herbert Morrison (3), Immaculate (2), Marymount High (1), St. Andrew High for Girls (2) and Knockalva Technical (1).*

It's interesting and important to point out that of the top 10 students inducted in Phi Beta Kappa, 7 were Jamaicans, *including the Valedictorian, Joyann Marks, formerly of Montego Bay High School for Girls.* Keep in mind that students who did professional courses for e.g. Nursing or Business Administration were excluded from this group. Of the 34 students, most graduated summa cum laude, magna cum laude or cum laude.

When **Valedictorian, Joyann Marks**, went up to make her presentation, she started her speech by quoting from the Hon. Marcus Mosiah Garvey, who said "If you have confidence in yourself, you have won even before you have started; without confidence you are twice defeated in the race of life". She held the audience rapt attention and earned herself a standing ovation at the end.

The Fisk University President, Hazel R. O'Leary, (former Secretary of Energy in Bill Clinton's Government) during her presentation stated that this is their best group to date. This is seen as a kind of record because this is the largest group of Jamaicans ever to have graduated from Fisk University. *At a reception after for students and parents, hosted by a Jamaican family (Dr. and Mrs. Bignal) a representative from the Jamaican Diaspora brought congratulatory greetings from the Consul General of Jamaica to Florida, the Southern United States, the Commonwealth of the Bahamas and the Cayman Island, the **Honorable Sandra Grant Griffiths.***

I consider this a "big ting" for Jamaica and just thought I would share, one love.

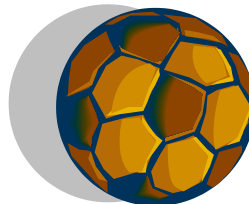
