More Students Gain Four or More Subjects In CXC

The Minister of Education, Hon. Andrew Holness has announced that 17,400 students gained four subjects or more in the Caribbean Examination Council (CXC) results this year (2011), 2,800 more than the 14,600 students who passed more than four last year. Mr. Holness said with the number improving by almost 3,000 the public school system has added another 3,000 students this year, "who will either be seeking a space in a sixth form institution, a tertiary institution, or requiring student loans or other forms of support." The Minister was speaking to journalists during a press briefing at his Hero's Circle offices in Kingston on August 19, 2011.

"The core of the CXC population is doing well. That's basically half of the sitting population, or 52 per cent, that would have received four or more subjects, so that's very positive for the education system on a whole," Mr. Holness said. Meanwhile, he pointed out that there has been a slight decline in Jamaica's overall performance in the CXC results, with the country recording almost a two per cent decline in overall grades at the regional examination, while Mathematics fell by six per cent and English A by 2.3 per cent. "Of important note is that the results of CXC have shown a general decline regionally. Jamaica is half of CXC's candidate entry, so clearly if there is a decline it would affect Jamaica as well, or Jamaica's decline would affect the region," he stated.

Mr. Holness said he was concerned about the six per cent fall in Mathematics passes, which included both public and private candidates. Mathematics results for public school candidates fell by 4.8 per cent. "Last year we had improved, this year we have a decline. I can't say why as yet, because we haven't done the in-depth analysis just yet," he stated. The Minister suggested that the changes in the way in which the Mathematics paper was presented by teachers might have had an impact on the results. "What CXC has said is that some teachers apparently were teaching to past papers with the old syllabus and did not make the change immediately," he explained. The Minister noted that while there was a decline in the results for some subject areas, more students were passing more subjects at the CXC level and that this augurs well for the system.

History of Church Teachers' College: Church Teachers' College began in September 1965 as Mandeville Teachers' College, with 75 students, twenty-four of whom were men. The institution was established with the blessing and authority of the Rt. Rev. Percival Gibson, then Bishop of the Anglican Diocese of Jamaica. The moving figure to obtain the facilities for a College of Education in Mandeville at that time was the Rt. Rev. Benjamin Vaughan, Bishop of Mandeville. He was the first chairman of the Board of Management, and he ensured that benefactors like the Kerr Jarrett family, Dr. Herbert Morrison and the Ministry of Education were convinced of the value of the College to the community and the island in general.

The College began with twenty-five pre-service teachers in the Primary Program and fifty in the Secondary Program. As the institution grew, it increased the number of Secondary Teachers and eventually became the only institution in the island which focused on the training of teachers for the age group 12+ to 17+. Later, Post-Certificate students in both Primary and Secondary areas were trained and since the dawn of the 90's the College has also trained University Graduates who wished to pursue professional qualifications with a Diploma in Teacher Education. Today, the College is on track to begin to prepare students for a degree in Secondary Education. From the outset, the College has been a member of the Joint Board of Teacher Education (JBTE) at the University of the West Indies which sets the programs and certifies its Diploma.

The College has grown from its small beginning and now has a student population of over four hundred students. The College enjoys a collaborative relationship with Temple University in the United States through which it offers the B.Sc. in Primary and Early Childhood Education. This program is designed for teachers who already hold a Diploma in Teaching.

Over the last forty years, the College has achieved high academic honors including awards for its performance in Mathematics, English and other subject areas in the final JBTE examinations. Many of its graduates, after furthering their education, are now teaching in universities in Jamaica, Canada, the United States of America, the United Kingdom and elsewhere, and a number of outstanding past students have been appointed principals of schools in Jamaica.

Church Teachers' College Alumni Association Inc, Florida: In January 2010, the first meeting to form Church Teachers' College Alumni Association, The Florida Chapter was convened at an 'all-you-can-eat' Chinese buffet restaurant by Ale Wilson who directed us on this journey. The format of a panel discussion was utilized to allow each member to voice the dream for the nascent organization. One of the special and exciting outcomes was that although the Alumni comprised multiple batches, everyone was of one mind; and after traveling down memory lane via the Batch Eleven Yearbook which also included memoirs of batches Ten, Eleven and Twelve students, the group dispersed late that evening convinced of being on the correct path. One other meeting was held at the China Buffet with several subsequent meetings held in Sunrise, South Florida, with Clover and Hepburn as note-takers. The food and fellowship were always great and much gratitude is extended to First Quality Home Health Care for sponsoring the meals.

What could be considered as the birth of the organization occurred at a meeting in May 2010 at the home of Mr. and

Mrs. Ale Wilson, for which we are thankful. Elected to the management board were President Mike Andrews, Vice President Hepburn Davis, Secretary Clover Hughie-Scott, Treasurer Barry Farquharson, and Assistant Secretary Heather Kettle. With the decision to establish the Association as a non-profit corporation, Pauline Schloss was instrumental in getting an acquaintance to provide some guidance in the legal process.

As this was virgin territory for everyone, the learning curve was entwined with hard work and several grueling meetings to work out the fine details. However, the high energy and high level of technology cultivated sound thinking and robust discussion by a cadre of members who met at the offices of First Quality Home Health Care. September 20, 2010 saw the Association accomplish its first goal of becoming incorporated as a not-for-profit entity demonstrated by a proud seal of incorporation. Yahoo and Facebook groups/pages were established to recruit members, exchange ideas and circulate information about the Association; and Ale Wilson was elected Vice President to fulfill a much-needed role.

As graduates of this great institution, we remain true to the philosophy of the Church Teachers' College that is based on two tenets, INDIVIDUAL WORTH and on EXCELLENCE. Through Church Teachers' College Alumni Association Inc, Florida, we will continue to focus on the development of the whole person, including the spiritual, academic, social, physical, cultural, aesthetic, religious and moral aspects, as we assist our alma mater and the communities in which we live.
